# Making a Fanal (Haitian lantern)

### What you Need

- 1 empty and clean aluminum can (we used a 13.5 oz can)
- 1 clear, clean, small jar that can fit snug into the can
- 1 battery-operated tea light
- Sculpting wire
- Tools
  - Drill with metal bit
  - Cloth to protect the table
  - Safety glasses
  - Pliers
- \*\*\*\*\*This is an activity that you do FOR your kids unless they are older and can use power tools.\*\*\*\*

## What we will do

- 1. Ensure that the can and jar fit snuggly together. Place the can on a cloth to ensure it doesn't slip and drill dozens of holes in your choice of pattern plus two parallel holes for the handle.
- 2. String the sculpting wire through the holes to create a handle
- 3. Place tea light in glass jar. Securely fashion the jar into the can

### Notes

A Fanal is an artisanal lamp made during the December holiday season in Haiti from a variety of upcycled materials. Often, they take the form of a paper house lined with tissue paper to create beautiful mosaics of color.

This activity however is based on the glass/aluminum can version (with some safety precautions of course). In Haiti, children can be seen making this version with a rogue nail, a recycled milk can, and empty baby food jars. Using the nail they fashion intricate holes into the can and a handle using chicken wire. They then fill the glass jar with cooking oil and a mesh of cotton as a wick. The baby food bottles fit firmly into the can. Enjoy! And don't forget to leave comments or tag us on social media if you use these
